We wish you a Safe and Happy New Year.





The Caledonian Society, the Waipu Highland Pipe Band, and the town of Waipu lost a great friend this year.

Fraser was active in the Caledonian Society and for a few years was the society's Chief. For many years he organised the Ceilidh on the evening of the Waipu Highland Games, reciting Robbie Burns "Ode to the Haggis." Fraser committed many





years to the society. Fraser was made a Life member in 2019 in recognition of dedication.

Fraser was also a member of the Waipu Highland Pipe Band and was an integral part of rebuilding the band when he returned to Waipu in 2003. Fraser and his son, Bruce, built the band up to be strong enough to compete in the National pipe band competition. He taught piping at the local school spending two to three days a week teaching, buying chanters for the children to practice on. Fraser started the tradition of piping at the Waipu Rugby Club matches, playing the pipes whenever the Waipu side scored. Fraser was made a Life Member of the band.

Fraser's kind and compassionate nature, and his 20 plus years of service to the Caledonian Society, The Pipe Band and the town will never be forgotten.

Host Clan

CLAN MACKENZIE

Clan MacKenzie had an early start in Southland in 1957 with an inaugural dinner held in the Scottish Hall, Invercargill. Although many wonderful events were held under the umbrella of this society, and as long-distance participations dwindled, the group became a bunch of enthusiastic Scottish families in the South.

The new Clan MacKenzie Society of New Zealand, started in 1995, at a meeting held Palmerston North following an advertisement placed in major New Zealand newspapers. A total of 27 people attended the first meeting, and they formed the nucleus of the present-day society. Anyone joining in the first three months were regarded as foundation members.

Approval for the New Zealand society had been given by the Chief of the clan, Lord Cromartie and the relationship between founder member Sonia MacKenzie, her husband Jock, and Lord Cromartie was instrumental in setting up of a strong foundation between the Scotland and UK branch which still exists. In 2015, Sonia was invited to plant a tree at Leod Castle n memory of her husband. Sonia is the current Patron of the New Zealand society.





At its peak the Clan had 600 members throughout New Zealand. Whilst numbers have decreased, the clan is still active nationally and is led by the current Lieutenant to Cabarfeidh, Jock McKenzie, who farms just South of Christchurch.

In December 2024, the clan will host the Waipu Highland Games and lead the morning march in and the parade of clans at the opening ceremony at noon. Jock will take the salute along with the Chief of the Waipu Caledonian Society at the morning march-in.

Jock is working with members of other clans to promote Scottish heritage, culture and music.

The Hororata Games is another major event attended by the clan and is a good venue to sign up new members.

The clan publishes a monthly diary of Scottish events being held throughout New Zealand and a quarterly newsletter. It holds annual gatherings each year in the North Island and South Island alternatively, and in 2025 celebrates its 30th anniversary.
